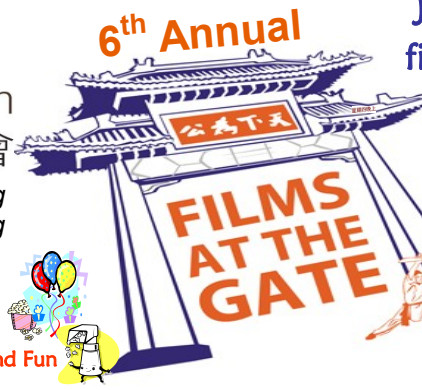

Thursday, August 25, 2011 (vacant lot on 10 Hudson Street)

07:00PM Short films and kung fu performance by Zhou Xuan Yun

08:00PM WAY OF THE DRAGON [猛龍過江] (1972) 88 min.

Written and directed by Bruce Lee. Starring Bruce Lee, Chuck Norris, and Nora Miao. Bruce Lee plays Tang Lung, a young martial artist from Hong Kong who travels to Rome to help out at a friend's restaurant. The local mafia kingpin wants the property and sends his thugs to shut down the restaurant. The standoff leads to a final battle in the Colosseum between Lee and a young Chuck Norris - one of the most famous cinematic smack downs of all time! In Cantonese.

Friday, August 26, 2011 (vacant lot on 10 Hudson Street)

07:00PM Short films, lion dance by Wah Lum Kung-Fu Association and kung fu trailers by Aric Mannion

08:00PM GALLANTS [打擂台] (2010) 100 min.

Directed by Derek Kwok and Clement Cheng. Starring Leung Siu-lung, Chen Kuan-tai, and Teddy Robin. A low budget indie film shot in 18 days with a cast of mostly over-the hill kung fu actors from the 70s, GALLANTS was a surprise hit in Hong Kong last year, and was named as "Best Film of 2010" by both the Hong Kong Critics Society and the Hong Kong Film Awards. An affectionate comedy about finding the soul of old Hong Kong in the modern day. In Cantonese.

Saturday, August 27, 2011 (Greenway Chinatown Park)

07:00PM Tai chi performance by Bow Sim Mark Tai Chi Arts Assoc.

08:00PM THE YOUNG MASTER [師弟出馬] (1980) 106 min.

Written and directed by Jackie Chan. Starring Jackie Chan, Shek Kin, Yuen Biao, and Lily Lee. Jackie Chan is an orphan raised in a kung fu school. When his older brother runs off to join a gang, Jackie volunteers to bring him home, which brings him into conflict not only with the gang, but also with the police, who mistake Jackie for his brother. In Cantonese.

Sunday, August 28, 2011 (Greenway Chinatown Park)

07:00PM Short films and live performance

08:00PM A MOMENT IN TIME (2010) 60 min.

A documentary about the experience of the Chinese in San Francisco's Chinatown, told through the films they loved. This retrospective film retells the immigrant story, and revives the emotions felt by audiences in Chinatown's theaters. An uplifting reflection on how cinema shaped the community, and a tribute to the Chinatown theater movie-goers. In English.

THE KID [細路祥] (1950) 77 min.

Directed by Fung Fung. Starring Bruce Lee, Yee Chau-shui, Lee Hoi-Chuen, and Fung Fung. Bruce Lee plays Ah Cheung, a poor orphan living with his uncle and cousins. Their fortunes seem to improve when a rich man (played by Lee's real-life father) crosses their path, bringing new opportunities. But soon complications arise, leading to Ah Cheung joining a gang which plans to rob the rich man's factory. In Cantonese.
